

State of Quality Child Care

Inclusive Child Care

- Serves children with and without disabilities together
- Each child's individual functional development is measured, with objective developmental goals to be achieved using developmentally appropriate practices
- Easter Seals model: Range of children with delays equals 25-40 percent of enrollment

Benefits of Inclusive Care

- Staff are focused on developmental milestones and the unique abilities of all children
- Children are exposed to peers with varying strengths, learning that each of us is unique
- Supplemental staff: Pediatric therapists collaborate with classroom staff to benefit all

Legal Obligations
